Important Additional Considerations

For the college bound scholar, the best rule of thumb to use to plan course selection is this: *Take four years of five solid classes*. Solid classes are ELA, Math, Science, Social Studies, and Foreign Language. While other courses are important – Art, Personal Finance, etc. - they are electives.

Most four-year colleges want their applicants to have *at least two years of one World Language* completed in high school. If a scholar chooses to do that minimum instead of a third and/or fourth year of foreign language, they should replace it with an ELA, Math, Science, or Social Studies course in addition to any electives.

The **Capstone Project** is an important milestone for every OAO scholar. We offer this to our juniors and seniors as a way to support them and honor the trust that has been placed in us with each scholar's education. Our goal is to give students a cutting edge for their future—whether that path leads to college

or a career. They will produce a written paper, an oral presentation, and a VR component as part of the project. This project allows students to explore their passions and demonstrate their unique strengths in a meaningful, marketable way. It's a powerful opportunity to showcase what makes them stand out.
